# 57th Annual FREE L.A. COUNTY HOLIDAY CELEBRATION

#### WHAT:

Join hosts **Cheryl Burke** (*Dancing with the Stars*) and **Brian White** (*Scandal, Mistresses, Chicago Fire*) for the Emmy® Award-winning '57th Annual L.A. County Holiday Celebration.' Music ensembles, choirs and dance companies from the many neighborhoods and cultures of the region celebrate the season during this free three-hour holiday show that is perfect for the whole family. PBS SoCal KOCE will broadcast this beloved program.

Highlights of Holiday Celebration favorites returning to the show include **Grandeza Mexicana Folk Ballet Company** with a folklórico dance from the region of Tabasco, Mexico; the **Harmonic Bronze Handbell Ensemble**, which will perform a classical handbell piece that celebrates Christmas and Hanukkah; holiday songs sung by the **Palmdale High School Choral Union and Sunday Night Singers**; and the **Southern California Brass Consortium**, a 26-member brass ensemble from Long Beach.

New to the show are the Grammy-nominated ragtime, Dixieland blues and early swing band **California Feetwarmers**, who will perform holiday favorites; **Cuba L.A.** performing Latin jazz renditions of holiday standards; Filipino dance company **Kayamanan Ng Lahi** with festive dances from the provincial lowland/coastal region of the Philippines; the 32-member **Los Angeles Chamber Choir**, which will sing the 16th century advent hymn "Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming"; **QVLN** (**Q-Violin**) bringing his "Brazil meets Jimi Hendrix on an electric violin" stylings to perform an upbeat Latin fusion of the Christmas classic "Little Drummer Boy"; and more.

# ARTISTS PERFORMING IN 57th ANNUAL L.A. COUNTY HOLIDAY CELEBRATION:

- California Feetwarmers\*, a seven-piece ragtime, Dixieland blues and early swing band, will perform holiday favorites.
- Citrus Singers, a 40-member voice and handbell ensemble from Citrus College, will perform Christmas songs featuring handbells.
- Colburn Children's Choir and Young Men's Ensemble, a youth choir from the Colburn School of Performing Arts, will perform a medley of holiday songs.
- Cuba L.A.\*, a seven-member music ensemble, will make their Holiday Celebration debut with Latin jazz renditions of holiday standards.
- Gay Men's Chorus of Los Angeles will return to the program with traditional holiday repertoire.
- Grandeza Mexicana Folk Ballet Company will present folklórico dance from the region of Tabasco, Mexico.
- Greater Los Angeles Cathedral Choir, a 35-member ensemble, will perform gospel renditions of holiday songs.
- Harmonic Bronze Handbell Ensemble, a music ensemble of 11 to 18-year-olds from Antelope Valley, will perform a classical handbell piece celebrating Christmas and Hanukkah.
- JazzAntiqua Dance & Music Ensemble will present a new dance piece with live jazz music inspired by the African-American spiritual "Wade in the Water."
- Kayamanan Ng Lahi Philippine Folk Arts\*, a 16-member Filipino dance company, will perform festive dances from the provincial lowland/coastal region of the Philippines.
- Kim Eung Hwa Dance Company, a nine-member Korean dance company, will perform a traditional fan dance.
- Las Colibrí \*, or "The Hummingbirds," an all-female mariachi ensemble, performs innovative interpretations of traditional *sones*, *huapangos* and *rancheras*, incorporating sounds of jazz, rock, oldies and R&B.
- Lorenzo Johnson & Praizum, 20 singers will perform an upbeat contemporary rendition of "Go Tell It on the Mountain."
- Los Angeles Chamber Choir\*, a 32-member voice ensemble, will make their Holiday Celebration debut with a beloved 16th century advent hymn.
- MUSYCA Children's Choir\* brings together gifted young people, ages four to 18, to create a community of singers built on respect, love for music and artistic excellence.
- Palmdale High School Choral Union and Sunday Night Singers, a chorus from the Antelope Valley, will present a traditional holiday repertoire.
- Pasadena Christian School Children's Choir\*, a 50-member children's chorus led by Barbara Allen, will perform light-hearted holiday songs featuring choralography.
- QVLN (Q-Violin)\*, Quetzal Guerrero will bring his "Brazil meets Jimi Hendrix on an electric violin" stylings to the Holiday Celebration with a seven-member ensemble playing an upbeat Latin fusion of the Christmas classic "Little Drummer Boy."
- Southern California Brass Consortium, a 26-member ensemble from Long Beach, will play symphonic brass arrangements of holiday repertoire.
- Vox Femina Los Angeles, a choir of 34 women, will perform songs celebrating Christmas and Hanukkah.
