Arts Education

On September 15, the Los Angeles County Arts Education Collective (Arts Ed Collective), formerly Arts for All, and the LA County Office of Education co-hosted a district arts coordinator meeting. District arts coordinators dialogued with colleagues about strategies to deepen learning for English Language Learners. Participants also received resources for professional development, updates on arts education legislation and district site level planning.

Launch of YES to ADU

In 2016, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors launched the Homeless Initiative, a comprehensive plan including strategies to increase affordable housing through the development of Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs.)

On Monday, September 18, as a part of the Homeless Initiative's Second Dwelling Units Pilot Program, the Civic Art program, in collaboration with the Department of Regional Planning, the Community Development Corporation, and Chief Executive Office, launched an architecture competition to reimagine the new typology for freestanding Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) in Los Angeles County. In the design competition, architects and designers become creative strategists in support of the Homeless Initiative to help promote the development of accessory dwelling units.

View Park Bebe Moore Campbell Library Dedication

On Friday, September 29 the renovated View Park Library reopened as the View Park Bebe Moore Campbell Library. The library's new name honors the late journalist and author, Bebe Moore Campbell, who lived in View Park. The Second Supervisorial District, Arts Commission and Public Library unveiled an exhibit of sculptures from the Golden State Mutual Collection, now part of the Civic Art Collection. The sculptures include African art and abstract pieces by well-known Los Angeles artists. Curator Jill Moniz placed the sculptures throughout the Library and their colors and shapes resonate with the Frank Matranga ceramic mosaic mural at the library's entrance, which was commissioned in 1976 when the library was first built.



Free Concerts in public sites / Musician's Roster

Free Concerts in Public Sites Program

The 2017 <u>Free Concerts in Public Sites Program</u>, a family-friendly summer concert series funded by the Board of Supervisors and administered by the Arts Commission, is in full swing. Scheduled from June to October, approximately 80 concerts are taking place in parks, outdoor amphitheaters, community centers, libraries and museums. Concerts feature LA County artists selected from the Musicians Roster.



Grants and Professional Development

Organizational Grant Program (OGP) and Community Impact Arts Grant (CIAG) Application Workshops

Application workshops for organizations interesting in applying to the Organizational Grant Program and the Community Impact Arts Grant were held on September 13, 16, 23 and 27 at locations throughout LA County, including the San Gabriel Mission Playhouse, A Place Called Home, Beyond Baroque and the Arts Commission office. Seven more workshops, including a webinar, will take place in locations throughout the county during October.

Arts Internship Grant Program Workshops

A application workshop for the LA County Arts Internship Grant Program was held on Wednesday, September 20 at the LA County Arts Commission. It was followed on Friday, September 22 by a conference call for those who could not attend in-person. Staff will convene additional conference calls on October 4 and October 19 to focus on guideline changes and answer any questions.

Professional Development

On September 16, the Arts Commission held an Arts Tune-Up at the San Gabriel Mission Playhouse. Approximately 60 artists and arts administrators attended and participated in sessions including "Advocacy 101," "How to Diversify and Manage Your Board" and "Your Fundraising Plan." The next Tune-Up will take place December 9 in Torrance.

On September 18, the Arts Commission reprised "Tips and Tricks for Artistic Documentation," a half-day workshop designed to assist prospective grant applicants in better documenting their artistic processes and products, and to help them better understand the characteristics of a high-quality artistic samples from the perspective of a grant panel. Approximately 25 arts administrators attended the workshop, which took place in downtown LA.

Also in downtown LA, the Arts Commission hosted "Writing Effective Grant Proposals" on September 26 and "Building Capacity in Arts Education on September 29." Both workshops were meant to further assist applicants to the Organizational Grant Program (OGP) and Community Impact Arts Grant (CIAG) programs. The former focused on crafting compelling grant narratives, and the latter provided an introduction to the Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) education standards and allowed participants to receive feedback on existing curriculum samples.
